



Finishes Care and Maintenance Instructions

WHITE GLOVE HANDLING STRONGLY RECOMMENDED FOR ALL SURFACES

Hand-blown Glass: For clear or tinted glass, wipe gently with distilled water. For Frosted or Textured glass, dust gently with a soft cloth or duster. Do not place any glass elements in the dishwasher or scrub heavily.

Tempered & Mirror Glass: A light glass cleaner can be used to clean flat glass surfaces with a soft cloth.

Leather: Dust lighting with soft cloth or duster, a distressed or natural patina is intentional on some of the products.

Brass: All Brass materials are finished with a living patina and are sealed with a light layer of wax. Dust lightly with a soft cloth or duster. Do not use any commercial cleaners as they will remove the patina. The patina is intended and expected to age over the course of the fixture's life. Natural oils from hands will affect how the patina ages.

Blackened Steel: Dust softly with soft cloth, microfiber, or duster. Do not use any commercial cleaners or attempt to reseal the steel. Blackened Steel, may collect dust during shipping due to static charge and change in climate. This is normal and can be removed by repeated microfiber dusting for the first few days after receipt.

Stone: Dust softly with soft cloth, microfiber, or duster. To clean, wipe gently with distilled water. For Acid-based liquids, such as coffee, wine, and fruit juice – Wipe up immediately using a clean, soft cloth. The longer a spill remains, the more difficult it will be to remove and may stain. Do not use abrasive, acid, alcohol-based, or solvent-based cleaners, they will damage the surface.

Wood and Veneer: Dust furniture daily with a slightly damp, soft, lint-free cloth or microfiber. Wipe with a dry, soft cloth in the direction of the wood grain. Once a month clean the surface with a soft distilled water-dampened cloth. Wipe the surface in the direction of the wood grain to remove dirt and fingerprints. Do not use chemical cleaners or polishes containing waxes or abrasives, or polishes that are oil based. If a scratch is deep, consult a professional furniture refinisher.

Lacquer Finish: With distilled water, wet a soft, clean cloth lightly and wring it out thoroughly. Excess water can damage lacquer finishes, ensuring that the cloth is barely wet to the touch. Hold a clean, dry cloth in your opposite hand. Wipe a small section of the furniture with the damp cloth in straight strokes. Immediately wipe this section with the dry cloth. Repeat this process until you've dusted the entire piece.

Chrome: Wet a soft, clean cloth with distilled water and add a small amount of Windex to remove finger prints from chrome finishes. Make sure the Windex / water mixture does not touch any other finish (wood, brass etc).

Surface Protection: Use protected pads, mats and coasters on furniture to protect the surface from spills and stains, and from heated objects. Do not use plastic or rubber on natural wood surfaces as they may soften and damage finish. Use felt under objects set on top of furniture that could scratch it.

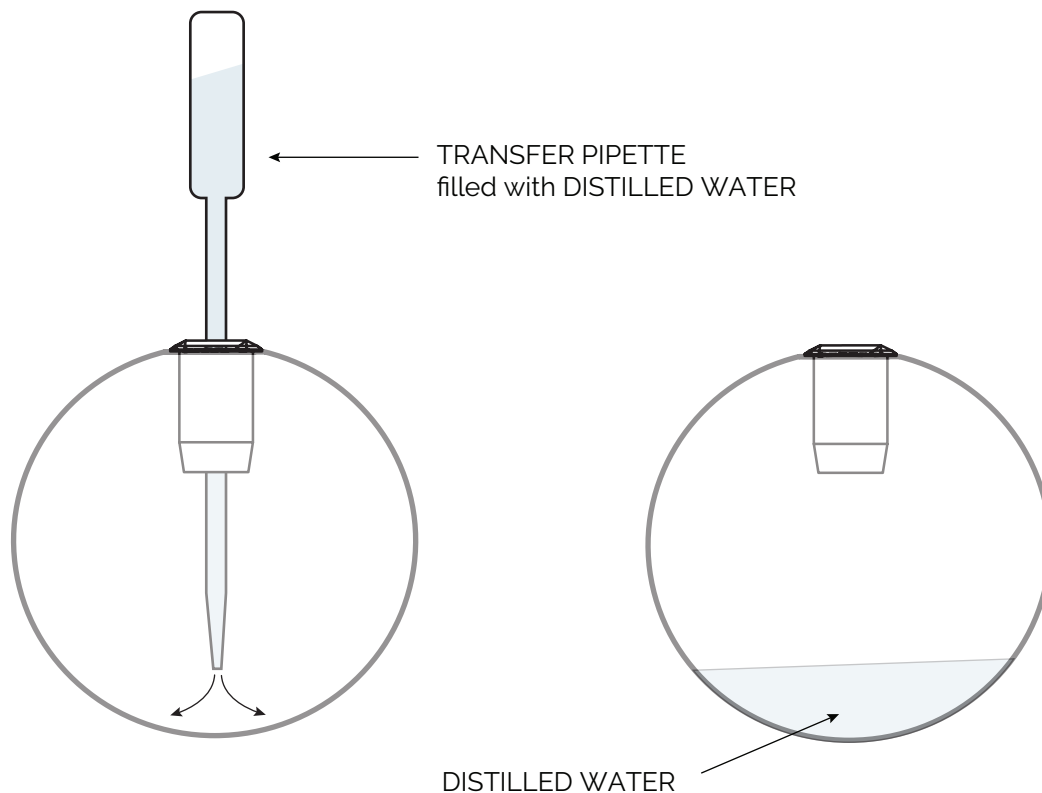
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Over time, visible dust may collect inside clear or tinted glass globes.

To clean the interior of the glass you will need **DISTILLED WATER** and a long **TRANSFER PIPETTE**.

ONLY USE DISTILLED WATER **Non-distilled water will leave permanent watermarks**

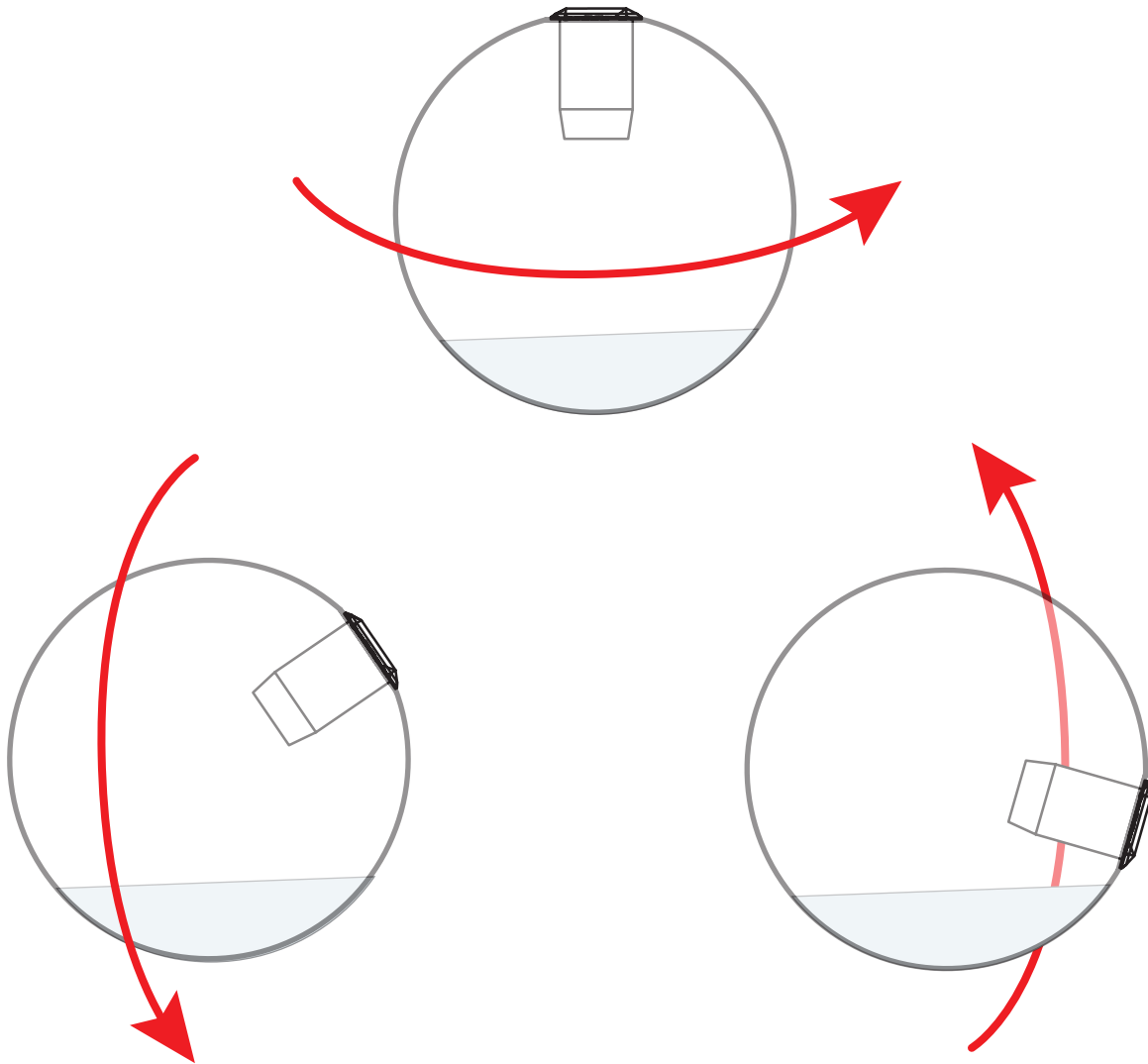
Transfer distilled water into the glass using the pipette.
Only one transfer should be needed; do not over-fill the glass.



IMPORTANT: DO NOT ALLOW WATER TO TOUCH THE BRASS INSERT.

The distilled water can create a waterline on the insert if it makes contact with the brass..

Slowly rotate the glass, while also slowly tilting the globe so the distilled water touches the complete interior glass surface while avoiding contact with the brass insert.

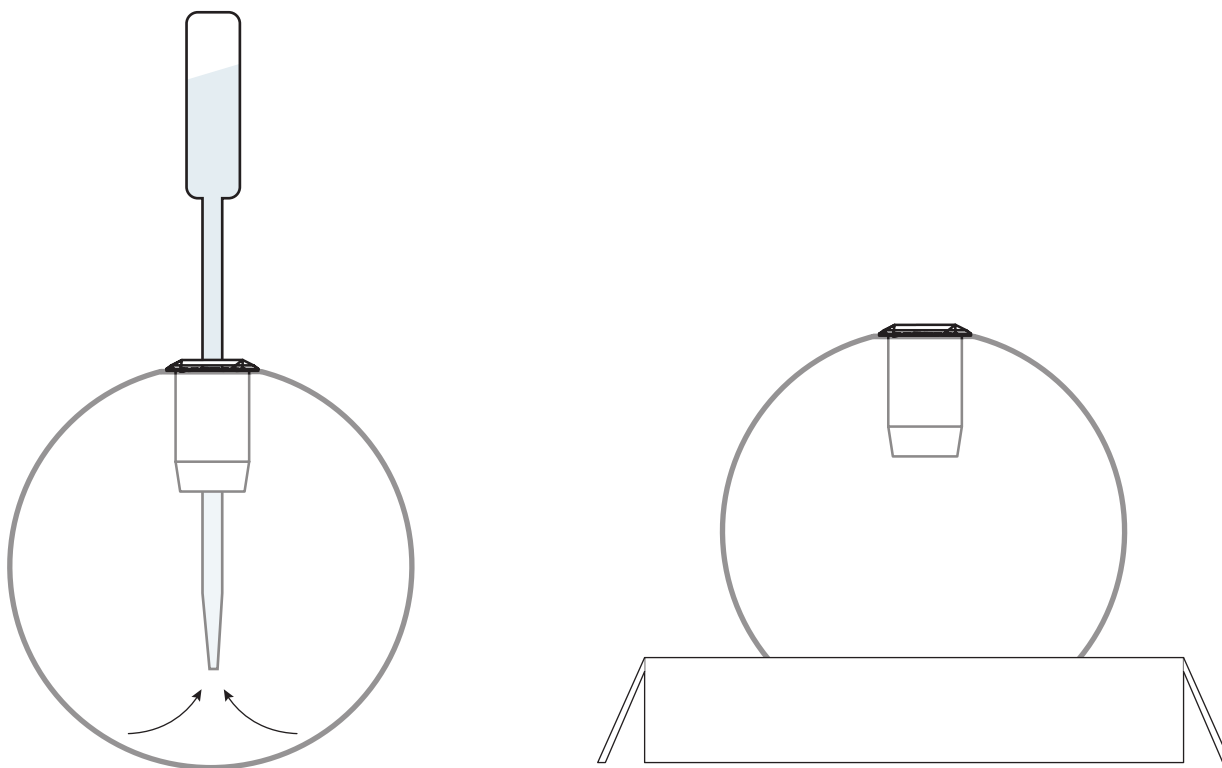


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Extract as much of the distilled water as possible using the transfer pipette.

The extracted water can be used to clean the exterior of the glass with a soft cloth but do not use it again for the interior rinsing process.



Let the glass globes air dry for 24 hours as shown using the boxes the glass was shipped in. If boxes were discarded during install; egg cartons also work to hold the glass inverted and prevents roll-risk.

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Elective Brass Re-Waxing Instructions

This is an optional revitalization if, after a few years, the brass finish on your piece loses its luster.

All Brass materials are finished with a living patina and are sealed with a light layer of wax. Do not use any commercial cleaners as they will remove the patina and wax layer. Natural oils from hands will affect how the patina ages. Always use gloves when handling all products.

NOTE: This process will NOT remove hand oil prints on the patina

Product list:

- SC Johnson Paste Wax (shown below)
- Microfiber Rag x 2
- Latex Gloves

Waxing Procedure

1. On a small section of the fixture, gently apply an even amount of wax with a rag in a circular motion.
2. Gently wipe off the excess wax with a clean rag in a similar circular motion.
3. Repeat steps 1 + 2 throughout the entire piece.
